ANN MULQUEEN was born in Castleconnell, County Limerick next door to Paddy Scanlon and the Mackey brothers, Mick and John who were famous Ahane and Limerick hurlers in the thirties and early forties.

She got her first songs and love of singing from her grandmother, a native of Co. Clare, across the Shannon. In her early teens, she entered fleadh cheoil competitions and won the All-Ireland under 18 titles in traditional singing three years in a row. Many radio and television appearances followed and her name became a household word among traditional music followers.

She has toured the U.S.A., Canada and Britain with Comhaltas Ceolteoiri Eireann and has also appeared on television in these countries.

NA CONNERYYS - A song about two brothers who were banished to New South Wales for coming into conflict with the landlord. They were natives of Bohadon, near Dungarvan, Co. Waterford.

THE FALLS OF DOONASS - It tells us about Doonass and its falls - which are no more, because of the E.S.B. Shannon Scheme.

THE EVELYN MARIE - About the trawler of this name lost off Burtonport, with six skippers aboard.

CA RABHAIS AR FEADH AN LAE UAIM - An international children's play song.

BONNY BUNCH OF ROSES - A Napoleonic song.

SWEET DUNGARVAN TOWN - In praise of Dungarvan, Co. Waterford.

MEET ME TO-NIGHT ON THE SHORE - A lament for a sailor whose ship was lost at sea and left his sweetheart waiting for him on the shore.
